Energy-Saving Answers: Office Equipment Article provided by Pacific Power

According to the U.S. Department of Energy, computers and office equipment are among the fastest-growing sources of electricity consumption in office and government buildings, and schools.



The following tips can help ensure your office equipment is not consuming unnecessary power:

- Turn off screen savers. While these programs can help avoid screen damage to some monitors, they actually waste power by keeping your computer active.
- Configure your computer to sleep mode. ENERGY STAR® settings are being configured into many computer systems. For ideal savings, set your power management to turn off your monitor after 10 minutes and your hard disk after 20 minutes.
- Turn off equipment when not in use. Contrary to popular belief, turning off older computers and printers will not wear them down more quickly. Turning off equipment at night can cut annual energy costs by as much as \$40 per computer.
- Consider upgrades. If your budget allows, look into newer computer models and flat screen monitors (which consume about 1/3 less energy).
- Consider laptops. They tend to use about 25 percent less electricity than most desktop models.

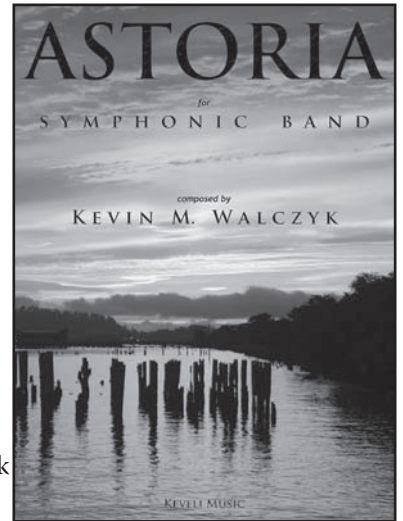

North Coast Symphonic Band Receives Commissioned Bicentennial Work

Dr. Kevin Walczyk, Oregon native and professor of music at Western Oregon State University, recently completed a new composition entitled ASTORIA to commemorate the Astoria Bicentennial. ASTORIA was commissioned by the North Coast Symphonic Band and will be performed at a free concert at the Liberty Theater on July 3, 2011. Dr. Walczyk describes the work as follows:

"ASTORIA was commissioned by the North Coast Symphonic Band to celebrate the bicentennial of Astoria, Oregon (1811-2011). The work's opening statement and primary theme incorporates the word "Astoria." Located at the mouth of the Columbia River, Astoria, and its rich cultural history, serves as the inspiration for this concert overture. The work pays tribute to the sea-faring town with a prominent sea shanty, and a "canneries" double fugue. The lyrical middle section pays homage to the decline of the city's lumber and canning industries while the celebratory climax of the work recognizes the vibrant maritime and manufacturing growth and the city's 200th birthday."

The North Coast Symphonic Band will begin rehearsing ASTORIA in the spring of 2011. In addition to ASTORIA, the July concert will feature traditional patriotic and familiar tunes and a special arrangement of songs from Shanghai'd in Astoria with ChrisLynn Taylor as soloist.

The 2011 Northwest Festival Hosting Association (NFHA) Annual Meeting is being hosted by the Astoria Regatta and will be January 14-16. The NFHA is an organization made up of festivals throughout the Pacific Northwest. The operating philosophy of the association is to work together and commit to supporting each other's events by sending a delegation to each member festival.

Music of the Victorian Era

The North Coast Symphonic Band will present a concert themed "Music of the Victorian Era" conducted by Larry Johnson at 2 P.M. on Sunday, January 30, at the Clatsop College Performing Arts Center, 16th and Franklin in Astoria. The concert band of today has its roots in the military bands of the Victorian era and many Victorian works are still mainstays in the band repertoire. Vintage Hardware of Astoria will decorate the lobby and auditorium with Victorian house parts.

Clatsop County Seniors First to Use Virtual Rehabilitation Technology

Mark Kujala preferred dry land to the open sea. He, too, graduated from Oregon State and returned to the food tech department at the university for professional training to run a commercial processing plant and micro-cannery. He started selling fresh seafood at the Beaverton Farmers' Market 15 years ago and continues to provide fresh, smoked and canned seafood that can't be rivaled.
